Dear Miss Olmsted,

I laid your request for reduction of fees for your students for next session before my Council at their meeting on Wednesday last when, after very careful consideration, it was decided with regret that it would not be possible to make a reduction for next session.

The fee charged to your students, namely 45 guineas, is very little more than the sum received by us for our students who are doing a similar course. For these students we have received up to the present £22.1. plus a grant of £18 from the Board of Education, making a total of £40.1. per student, but for next session we have found it necessary to raise our College fees from 21 guineas to 24 guineas and so shall be receiving £43.4. per student. The addition paid by your students of £4.1. is, as you will readily understand, more than counterbalanced by the extra expense involved in the additional teaching required by them.

My Council desire me to convey to you their regret that they are not able to meet your request and we hope much that we may again have the pleasure of receiving your students at Bedford College next session.
