She asks whether instead of continuing her C.O.S. work next term for two days a week she might be allowed instead to be attached to the Mental After Care Association or to a psychiatric social worker to do home visits in this special type of social work. Miss Hakola, as you know, has done a considerable amount of this special form of work in Finland and is very used to dealing with mental patients. The type of work she would be doing would be social work of a specialised kind, and she asks whether, if she did this, it would qualify her for her certificate at the end of the year.
