New One Year Course in Social Work for International Students.

The Director pointed out that in accordance with the
regulations laid down by this Committee, this Course required
30 lectures in Modern Industrial Problems. The course for
International Students is 20 lectures only. This would mean
if the directions of the Committee were to be carried out, that
10 extra lectures would have to be put on for one student who
had been accepted for the Course in Social Work. The Committee
considered the question and resolved

RESOLVED

that this Committee are satisfied that the student accepted for the One Year Course in Social Work should have 20 lectures on the "Comparative Study of Some Modern Industrial Problems" together with directed reading for the remainder of the work required, for the present year.
