HYGIENE COMMITTEE.

Extracts from the minutes of Academic Board.

Dec. 2nd, 1913.

Hygiene Course. Recommendations from the Hygiene Committee, passed at a meeting on Oct. 16th were submitted.

The Principal explained that the two-year course planned last session had been found impossible to work, since it depended to some extent on the recognition by the University of Physiology as an Intermediate subject. As this was still deferred, the Hygiene Committee had re-cast the scheme, which they submitted in its new form together with certain new recommendations as to

a) the award of diplomas.

b) Recognition as part of the course of the practical work carried on by the students under the guidance of the Westminster Health Society.

c) Approaching the Sanitary Inspector's Board (whose certificate is at present the only one recognised for public Inspectors in London and the Provinces) to endeavour to get them to alter the date of one of their examinations in London from April to the end of June. (The other examination is held in January.

d) Approaching the Board of Education and the Local Government Board to recognise the College diploma as one qualifying for a Sanitary Inspectorship in Great Britain.

The Board resolved to submit the reommendations to the Council.
