

Report on International Nurse Administrator Students

The nine Nurse Administrator students have completed a very satisfactory term's work. The courses of lectures on Hospital and Training School Administration are now finished and the standard of the marks attained by the students on their papers during the term has been quite satisfactory.

During the Easter vacation, practical work was arranged for the students in various hospitals, according to their individual needs.

Miss Besesti spent three weeks at St. Thomas's Hospital, studying principally the work in the Preliminary Training School and social service in the Lady Almoner's department.

Miss Christova spent nearly a fortnight up in Sheffield, at the Royal Infirmary, and was shown the administration work in various departments, including the wards. For the last fortnight she attended daily University College Hospital Preliminary Training School.

Miss Diskul spent three weeks at King's College Hospital, visiting every department and spending a considerable time in the hospital kitchen, in the organisation of which she was specially interested.

Miss Gudmundssen spent three weeks at the King Edward VII Memorial Hospital, Ealing, a hospital of approximately the same size as that to which she is hoping to return.

Mrs. Nulle Sieceniaks and Miss Staehle has been up in Scotland for three weeks at the Royal Infirmary, Glasgow, where they have had a most interesting time studying every department of the hospital and seeing a good deal of Scotland at the same time.

Miss Petschnigg spent a week at St. Thomas's Hospital, seeing the work in Out-patient and Lady Almoner's departments and in the Preliminary Training School. After Easter she went to the West London Hospital for a fortnight and gained very practical experience in the running of the whole hospital.

Miss Voipio spent the whole 3 weeks in the Preliminary Training School at University College Hospital, her intention being to return to her own country as Directress of the Municipal Preliminary Training School at Viborg.

Miss Zukowska was at the Royal Infirmary, Manchester for the whole three weeks - and studied the administrative work in every department of the hospital.

Reports on the Students' work have been asked for from the matrons of the various hospitals in each case, but have not yet been returned to the College of Nursing.
