Dear Miss Tuke,

In confirming both Professor Winslow's and my conversation with you regarding the proposed course for International students, and in order that we may get out immediately, literature regarding the course, may we have a statement from you as soon as your Committee has acted upon the matter, answering the following questions:

1. May we announce that an International Public Health Nursing course will be given at Bedford College for Women, University of London, as requested by the League of Red Cross Societies?
2. That following the session, if the final examination is passed, some form of certificate will be given showing that the student has studied for one year and successfully passed examinations at Bedford College.
3. That in case of slight illness the students will be cared for in the College infirmary, but in case of more severe illness students will be taken to a nursing home at the expense of the student.

The other points which we would like approved by you and which I marked in the bulletin I sent you the other day include:

- Qualifications for admission:-
- Age, Education, Training, Health, References, Language,
  - Application.
  - Session - Length.
  - Holidays.
  - Outline of course and excursions.

The League is prepared to guarantee ten students, this, however does not preclude the idea that more students may not be present.

We would not be able to tell you the exact number until shortly before the course opens, but, owing to the fact that we are late in announcing the course, we will most probably not have over ten or twelve students this year.

We will be glad to know as soon as you can make a final statement concerning the amount of tuition and other incidental fees connected with the course.
