Dear Mrs. Carter,

I am directed by the Council of Bedford College to write and let you know that the question of the continuance of Courses for International Students after the close of the session 1929-30 has been carefully considered by them after receiving reports from the Organisation Committee and the Academic Board of Bedford College. I am to say that my Council are prepared to carry on the work for at least a further two years on the understanding that the League is still prepared to give financial support to the work and that Bedford College on their side will make such economies as are possible. To this end the following resolution was passed:-

"That courses for International Students be continued for the sessions 1930-32 on the same lines as hitherto, with such economies on the educational side as are consistent with efficiency."

Definite proposals for the continuance of the work during the sessions 1930-32 will as you are aware be the subject of a report from Bedford College in October next.

I have also to inform you of the following resolution which was passed at the last meeting of the Organisation Committee in May about which I fear I omitted to write to you:-

"That three lectyres by Miss Edith Smith, A.B.,R.N., on Health Publicity be included in the course for International Students, it being understood that the League was willing to finance this course."
