re Miss Itta Frascara of the Italian Red Cross

You will find in the Bedford College records that this student was registered for the Public Health Course for the session I922/23. She completed the first two terms, but did not return to College for the 3rd term on account of her father's serious illness.

She did not receive the regular League certificate, but was, I believe, given a Statement by the League to the effect that she studied for some months in London.

Since her return to Italy Miss Frascara has been working with the Italian Red Cross at the central office doing responsible work.

I met her in Montreal in July, where she was representing the Italian Red Cross at the Congress of the International Council of Nurses. She explained to me that she was most anxious to return to Bedford College to complete her studies, and to take the examination and obtain the regular certificate.

I have recently received a letter from her repeating this request, and I have written and told her that I will bring the matter up before the Bedford College Committee.

I have already explained to her that the ground covered by the lectures is very much changed since I922,

and that she will be very handicapped if she only completed the last term. She, however, seems very determined, and I shall be glad, therefore, if the Committee would consider the question at its next meeting.

Mrs. Reid will remember Miss Frascara well, as she returned to London in 1928 for the Presentation of Certificates when she represented the Marchesa di Targiani Giunti on the platform.

Very many thanks for the agenda of the meeting and the minutes of the last committee meeting, which reached me a few days ago.
