Thank you very much for your letter of February 8th containing the resolutions passed by your council.

*Hospital Administration Course*

With reference to n° 1 we will do our utmost to carry this out. In the past when we have known a candidate had very little knowledge of the language or lacked experience, we have tried to get her over earlier, but our difficulty has been to always discover this. I am afraid out of a group of 20 - 24 we shall always have to count upon two or three who do not quite come up to our standards.

*Continuance of existing arrangements for 1929-30*

With regard to n° 2 this recommendation of your council will be brought before the Executive Committee, which meets in March, with a recommendation from the Secretary General that it be approved. While we can say nothing more definite than this at the moment, Mr. Kittredge feels that it will no doubt be approved.

I am very glad to know that the whole question of the future of the International Courses will come up for consideration during the coming year, and a decision arrived at as to whether they are to be continued and on what financial basis. As a preliminary step, I wonder if the Principal could spare the time to have a talk with Sir Arthur Stanley on the whole question. He is "rapporteur" on nursing questions to the Executive Committee, and I think it would be interesting and helpful


