Dear Principal,

I have received your letter of March 26th containing the resolutions passed by your Council concerning the re-organization of the Joint Advisory Committee.

The League is entirely in agreement with your suggestions and would be glad if you would take steps to secure the co-operation of the College of Nursing. A copy of your letter is being forwarded to Sir Arthur Stanley, Chairman of the British Red Cross Society, a member of the Board of Governors and Chairman of the College of Nursing, asking him to assist in securing the co-operation of the latter.

In the event of your being able to secure this, and in order to enable the College of Nursing to take more responsibility with regard to the coaching of the students and the planning of their practical work, the League is willing to subsidize the salary of the nurse appointed by the College of Nursing, provided that this does not exceed the sum of £200 a year and that it can be taken out of the Fund which is already available to your Committee for the development of the Courses.

Will you kindly convey to your Council the League's appreciation of the step which it has taken? The League has always endeavoured to promote the highest educational standard, bearing in mind the needs of the countries from which the students come. In placing its

educational work in London in the hands of a Committee of a College of the University in which the nursing profession is represented, the League feels that the future standard is absolutely safeguarded. The League also feels that the step which Bedford College is taking is a tribute to the standard maintained by the students who have passed through the Courses and assures you that, in selecting the candidates and recommending them to your Committee, every endeavour will be made to maintain that standard.
