COURSE UNITS IN NURSING


Thank you for your letter of 18 June enclosing an advance copy of the proposal for course S290 "Chemotherapeutics and Pathophysiology". Professor Oppe telephoned me today and asked that, before I circulate the proposal to members of the SAC (as agreed at the meeting on 14 May), I should seek from you information relating to the proposed teaching arrangements for this course.

This is in order that I may make any appropriate insertion in section 14 of the form which relates to any form of shared teaching arrangement between the School offering the course and another. At the meeting on 16 October 1981 it was reported that Bedford College were proposing that the pharmacology content should be taught "by an appointed Teacher at the Middlesex Hospital Medical School". I appreciate however that changes may have occurred since then as the content of this one course-unit course is different from that of the two separate half-unit courses originally proposed.

I am copying this letter to Mr Turnbull in anticipation of receiving from him a proposal form signed on behalf of the College.

An early reply would be appreciated if the proposal is to be circulated before SAC members discuss for the summer.
