Central Midwives Board Examination for Midwife Teachers 1933.—A special course of study is arranged by the College of Nursing and the Midwives' Institute to meet the needs of students preparing for this examination.

Occupational Therapy.—A six months' course has been arranged in conjunction with the Mandsley Hospital.
