Dear Miss Monkhouse,

In reply to your letter I am writing to say that I shall be very pleased to change the day and time of my lectures on "History of Nursing" (which I take it is the course ~~referred~~ referred to in your letter under the title of "Hospital Nursing") to a time more convenient to the International Students. It would however suit me much better if the students could come at 9.30 a.m. instead of 9 a.m. on Friday, as they did when this course was given to them in the Michaelmas Term of 1929.

May I however point out that this was not the original time of the lectures, but that in other sessions (1928-29 and 1927-28) they have been given at 6 p.m. on Thursday.

We are always most anxious to consult with you and to arrange mutually convenient times for lectures, and you will no doubt recollect that a list of the lectures for the Session 1930-1931 was sent to you by Miss Bowes before she left the College of Nursing last July.

The time then put down for the "History of Nursing" lectures was 6 p.m. on Thursday, and I had no intimation until last week that this would not be a convenient time for the International Students.
