Miss Wall's New Post

Miss Wall, who is retiring this week from the post of Secretary to the Public Health Section of the College of Nursing, is shortly taking up a new appointment, that of visitor to the Central Council of District Nursing. This, too, is a post she is well qualified to fill.

Trained at St. Thomas's Hospital, S.E.1, Miss Wall also possesses her C.M.B. and tuberculosis certificates and the certificate for the Florence Nightingale International Course at Bedford College for Women. In addition, Miss Wall has had two years of experience with the Queen's Institute of District Nursing, and after the War worked for some time for the Friends' Emergency Committee at Châlons-sur-Marne
