*Dear Miss Monkhouse.*

Many thanks for your letter. I have noted 30th June for the Presentation of Certificates.

The suggestion that Dame Florence Barrie Lambert should be asked to speak to the meeting from the nursing point of view is an excellent one, and I suggest that you should approach her. I think that it would come better from you than from myself.

As regards the Presentation of the Certificates I really have not got anyone to suggest. The Duchess of Gloucester is the only female member of the Royal Family who has not presented the certificates, and perhaps she might be approached. I should much like to have a word with you on the telephone about this.

I should also like to discuss with you the question of inviting Lord Baldwin to address the meeting. I think it would be better, if we can, to find someone who is in closer touch with nurses and the nursing profession. I do not know that Lord Baldwin has ever shown any interests in the matter, but you may know that he has done so, in which case, of course, we could not get a better speaker.
