Mrs. Marion Ferguson, Director of Nursing Studies at Bedford College, has asked me to contact you in connection with 'community' experience for students on our undergraduate course in Nursing Studies leading to a B.Sc./S.R.N.

The first group (seven students) will be required to undertake this experience for two days a week during January-March 1984. Owing to the difficulties of placing students in the Inner London area, we are approaching the outer districts for district nursing and health visiting experience and we would be very grateful for any help you may be able to offer in placing these students. We have generally found two placements per district to be a reasonable number.

We would also like to offer a very short community experience to our first-year students, beginning in October, 1982. This would be on October 21st/22nd, and 28th/29th, and November 4th/5th, and would be limited in range, being three days with a health visitor and three days with a district nurse.
