I am writing on behalf of the Council of Bedford College to ask whether you will honour the College by accepting an invitation to be present and speak at the Presentation of Certificates to the International Students on the 23rd June 1933 at 3.30 p.m.

The International Courses are offered by the League of Red Cross Societies in conjunction with Bedford College for Women and the College of Nursing with a view to meeting the demand in all countries for nurses trained in public health work and for directors and teachers in training schools who are qualified to emphasise the preventive and social, as well as the curative aspects of disease.
