1. Minutes.

2. Arising out of the Minutes.

a. Letter from Miss Daisy Bridges.

A letter from Miss Daisy Bridges accepting appointment as Tutor in Practical Work to the International Students was read. The letter stated that her Fellowship from the Rockefeller Foundation did not expire until 1st October 1938 and asked for permission to take up her duties as soon after that date as possible. Miss Coode, on behalf of the College of Nursing, agreed that Miss Bridges should be permitted to take up her new duties a few days later, as required under the terms of her Rockefeller Fellowship.
