I have a new form of practical work report this year, on which I receive a statement from the centres where the students work.

I find these a help, both to myself and to the superintendents of the Centres who plan the students' work. (a copy is attached).

I have assessed these reports and tried to mark them in the same way that we mark the written work, but I do not find it easy. The standards expected of the students vary very much in the different centres.

On the whole, the average standard of practical work is not high this year. This is partly due to language difficulty, but I do not think, entirely.

We are having more time this term for practical work; there is to be at least one day free for it, and I have planned individually for each student.

Certain of the hygiene ~~work~~ visits are much improved now that I am able to arrange for an expert to meet us and explain the more technical subjects. I have arranged with Mr. Clay, the Sanitary Inspector at the London School of Hygiene, to give us two demonstrations in the Museum there, this term, and they should be a valuable addition.
