Dear Miss McEwan,

I am extremely sorry I have not been able to write earlier in reply to your letter of October 28th. I understand from Mr. Mace that after his conversation with you last week, it was arranged that the students taking Industrial Nursing should attend for the three terms at 2 o'clock on Tuesdays for the course in Applied Psychology, as this is now so arranged that it deals with the topics formerly included in Psychology of Infancy and Adolescence.

The lectures on the Industrial System are held this term. Mrs. Williams does not lecture in the second term, but elementary Economics is covered in the third term. The fee of four guineas therefore is correct for this course, the Industrial System and Economics. An additional fee of four guineas will, however, be due in respect of each student for the Applied Psychology course.

I see that one Industrial Nurse, Miss Mainland, was omitted in the account sent to you on October 26th. Her name will, therefore, be added to the list. Mrs. Starkie will, I understand, attend Psychology only this term and take Applied Psychology next year, if she is able to make arrangements to do so. I am asking the Secretary to send you an account amended in accordance with this alteration.

The Principal regrets it is not possible to charge an inter-Collegiate fee for the Industrial Nurses. They are in a different category from students of the College of Nursing who attend the short course of lectures by Dr. Doyne Bell.
