## NURSING STUDIES

As you may have heard, the Vice Chancellor agreed during the Summer to the setting up of a University Working Party, with Professor Le Quesne as Chairman, with the following Terms of Reference:

"To review the provision of Nursing Studies in the University bearing in mind forthcoming Institutional changes".

For your information I am attaching, separately, a list of the membership.

The Working Party has now held its first meeting and has agreed that the next step is to meet on separate occasions with those persons most concerned with the Nursing courses at Bedford and Chelsea Colleges.
