REPORT OF THE PRACTICAL WORK DONE BY PUBLIC HEALTH STUDENTS.

EASTER VACATION 1929.

Four weeks of the Easter vacation were spent in Practical Work. a detailed time-table is attached giving the work done by each student during that time.

Six students spent a week in East Sussex, kindly arranged for them by the County Nursing Association in conjunction with the Medical Officer of Health. They studied the organisation of Public Health work in the county and each spent a day or two going round with a nurse in her district.

Four students spent a week with the L.C.C. school nurses.

After Easter nine students went to France where they had a programme arranged for them by the League and organised by Mademoiselle Lefebvre of the Headquarters Staff. This included visits to the work in and around Paris, also in Soissons where they saw the organisation of a generalised service in a rural district. Several students went on to Brussels and saw the Red Cross work there, also the training school for Public Health Nurses organised by Mademoiselle Mechelynck (an Old International).

Arrangements were made by the Commonwealth Fund for three Austrian students to visit Nancy in order to see the work there. This is mainly Tuberculosis Work, but there has been a recent development of Maternity and Child Welfare there, which, I understand, is being used as an additional means of training nurses for Public Health work.

Miss Hamblin and Miss Martin spent the four weeks attached to Health Centres in Westminster and actually undertaking work there, under supervision.

Miss Sanguan spent three weeks at the St. Thomas's Babies' Centre, studying infant dietetics and management and Miss Albo had some observation work with Miss Whitehead in Radlett.

I have been in touch with Birmingham, East Sussex and Hertfordshire with a view to visiting these places and finding out more about the facilities for student work there. Birmingham are at present undergoing a somewhat drastic re-organisation of their Health Visitor staff and are not yet ready for visitors. Miss Wyatt in East Sussex and Miss Harrington in Herts have both undertaken to arrange a week's visit for me to their respective Associations. I hope to go knexe to both shortly.
