Considerations:

Because nurses are mainly women and because they form both the major part of the health-care labour force and of the patient population, knowledge about women's position in society is both desirable and essential. They are underrepresented in the higher eschelons of the medical, nursing and administrative hierachy; they exhibit differences in disease patterns from those of men; their treatment as patients often indicates how health-care professionals have incorporated into their professional attitudes socially derived sterotypes of sex and gender and their social position shows constraints compared to those of men.
