1903-1919 Born 1872, studies medicine in Upsala and Stockholm, where she took her Bachelor of Medicine in 1900 and qualified as a specialist in Venereal Disease and Gynaecology. After special post-graduate study in Paris, Vienna, and Stockholm, in 1903 she was appointed Director of the free clinic for women suffering from Venereal Disease, run by the Municipality of Stockholm, and this post she held until 1919 and periodically since although the clinic now is run by the State.

Appointed as Medical Inspector of industrial workers in Stockholm. In 1910 published in collaboration with Dr. Julia v. Sneidern a book on Sex Hygiene and Sex Education which was awarded first prize in a public competition for books on this subject. A third edition of the book was translated into English in 1926 (Henry Holt, New York.)

1919-1921 Appointed member of a Government Committee for elaborating a plan for popular Sex Education, especially with a view to combating the spread of venereal disease.

1933-1934 Appointed member of a Committee to elaborate a draft to change the penal law on abortion.

Member since 1935 of a delegation of Medical experts to the Population Commission (Government).

1930-1932 Member of the League of Nations travelling commission to enquire into the traffic in women and children in the East.

1932. Member since 1932 of the International Labour Correspondence Committee on Women's Work.

1929-1935 President of the Swedish Medical Women's Club.

since 1934 President of the Medical Women's International Association.
