Dear Miss Monkhouse,

The Council of the College of Nursing has considered the proposals put forward by your Council concerning the payment of tuition fees between Bedford College and the College of Nursing.

The Council agrees with your Council that the time has come for the revision of the present arrangements.

With regard to paragraph 1, page 2, of the proposals submitted by Bedford College to the College of Nursing, the Council does not consider it a good principle that Bedford College should be responsible for the cost of lectures (a) (b) and (c) which are open to College of Nursing students also, but considers in view of the fact that these courses of lectures have been arranged primarily for International Students and have lately been extended at the request of the "Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students" the course should be subsidised, and the sum suggested is 20 guineas.

The Council appreciates the concession made by Bedford College in the proposal that in future students of the College of Nursing be allowed the benefit of intercollegiate rates, and my Council desires that the same shall apply to students of Bedford College attending lectures at the College of Nursing.

With reference to the latter, my Council would point out that the charge made to College of Nursing members is one of the privileges of membership of the College in return for the annual subscription paid by them to the College, and to extend this privilege to non-members, as suggested by Bedford College, would lead to much criticism.

The Council hopes that your Council will agree that it is advisable to adopt the same principle for Bedford College students attending the College of Nursing as for students of the College of Nursing attending Bedford College.

In your letter you make a note that at the time a payment of 15 guineas was arranged for students for the courses (a) (b) and (c) no contribution was made to Miss Bowes' salary. In this connection I would remind you that at the time referred to the Education Officer was not responsible for the practical work to the extent that she is now, or for coaching the students, and that it was for these services the contribution was principally made.

In conclusion I am directed to say how much the College of Nursing appreciates the co-operation of Bedford College, and it trusts that the above proposals will be acceptable to your Council.
