On the motion of the Chairman the Secretary of Bedford College was made Secretary of the Committee.

1. Minutes.

The minutes of the last informal meeting of the Committee had been circulated and were confirmed and signed as correct.

Arising out of the Minutes.

a. Name by which the Committee should be known.

Some discussion took place as to what the title of the newly constituted Committee should actually be. There was a decided opinion that the word 'advisory' should not form part of the title.

RESOLVED

that the full name of the Committee be, "Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students."

b. Title for Officer to be appointed.

The Chairman asked the Committee for suggestions for the title for the Officer to be appointed to direct the practical work of the International Students.

It was unanimously agreed that 'Tutor' would be the right title for such an Officer.

Recommended

that the Officer attached to the College of Nursing especially appointed to direct the practical work of the International Students, whose salary was to be a charge on the grant made to Bedford College for Women by the League of Red Cross Societies for the development and improvement of the Public Health and Nurse Administrators Courses, be called 'Tutor to the International Students.'

2. Communications received.

Apologies for absence were received from: - Miss Darbyshire Miss Lloyd Still.

3. Gurricula for the International Students.

- i. A draft of the proposed course for Public Health Workers and for Nurse Administrators was before the Committee and is appended. Certain amendments were made as follows:
 - a. Fage 1, paragraph 2 line 5, insert after 'the University of London; the words "in conjunction with the College of Nursing."
 - b. Page 1, paragraph 2, three lines from the bottom, delete sentence beginning "the second course" down to 'Nursing'.
 - Page 1, bottom line, bottom paragraph, replace the words 'Easter holidays' by the words "Christmas and Easter Vacations".
 - d. Pages 2 and 3, list of Committee was corrected and the name of the Secretary inserted.
 - e. Page 4, paragraph 1, 'Requirements for Admission'.

 Some discussion took place as to the wisdom of putting no age limit for application. It was agreed to leave out such limitation for the year 1927-28. The first sentence was accordingly altered to read as follows, "Applicants must be not less than 21 years of age and" etc.,

- f. Page 5, paragraph 3, line 1, replace the word 'reserves' by the word "has".
- g. Page 6, paragraph 1, line 2, replace the word 'required' by the word "invited".
- h. Page 6, paragraph 3, line 5, delete the word 'trips'.
- i. Page 7, paragraph 1, replace the word 'Orient' by 'Tropical Countries" and insert at end of paragraph the words "of the London School of Hygiene and of Tropical Medicine."

Mrs. Carter called the attention of the Committee to the fact that the lectures on Public Health Nursing (see IJ above) had been omitted in the Nurse Administrators Course for the same reason that the History of Nursing had been omitted from the Public Health Course. The Committee approved of the decision.

Notes.

It was agreed that a paragraph should be inserted here to the effect that Physiology might be substituted for one of the 'Required Subjects' at the discretion of the Director of Studies at Bedford College.

The Committee further decided that a note should be added after the 'Outlines of Study' to the effect that in addition to the formal lectures, considerable time is given to discussion and tuition classes.

iv. Lecturers for the Courses.

Page 10. The Committee agreed that Lecturers for the Courses should be arranged as follows where no name had been mentioned in the syllabus.

II Public Health Nursing, 30 lecture hours by specialists.

The Committee agreed that the outline of this course should be worked out by a sub Committee consisting of

III Maternity and Child "elfare, 10 lecture hours.

That Pr. Waller be invited to give 10 lectures on Maternity and Child Welfare on the same terms as for 1926-27, or failing him, Pr. Hazel Gregory of the Royal Free Hospital, or failing her, Dr. Mabel Brodie.

VII Nutrition, 8 lecture hours.

That Dr. Plimmer be invited to give 8 lectures on Mutrition on the same terms as for 1926-27.

VIII Tuberculosis, 6 lecture hours.

That Dr. Gloyne be invited to give 6 lectures on Tuberculosis on the same terms as for 1926-27.

XI Psychiatry, 6 lecture hours.

That Dr. Alice Hutchison. be invited to give 6 lectures on Paychiatry on the same terms as for 1926-27.

Edus Coport Professional Ethics.

The Committee agreed that 2 or 3 lectures on Professional Ethics were desirable and Miss Cowlin of the College of Nursing was asked to arrange for these slectures.
