Dear Dr. Mess,

Thank you for your letter of November 9th in connection with which I send you the following resolution which was passed by the Finance Committee at its meeting last Friday:

"That the following fees be paid on behalf of International Students out of the composition fee received by the College, without prejudice to future procedure:

- a. On behalf of Miss R.V.Wheelock (America) £15.15.0 for a course on 'Statistics' by Professor Pearson at University College.
- b. On behalf of Miss O.F.Griffith (Great Britain) £4.4.0 for a course on Psychopathology and Mental Hygiene at King's College, and £3.3.0 for a clinical course at the Tavistock Clinic.
- c. On behalf of Miss M.M.Robertson (Great Britain) £4.4.0 for a course on Psychopathology and Mental Hygiene at King's College."

The Finance Committee is later going into the whole question of the cost of the International Courses, but meanwhile it does not want to hold up any of the above, hence its resolution.

With regard to the queries in your letter of November 9th, I think the only thing we can say is that outside courses may be recommended where they are academically desirable, and that each case must be considered on its merits.
