Dear Miss Baggallay,

The recommendations from the Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students in connection with arrangements for the Presentation of Certificates in July next, were before the Council of Bedford College at their meeting last week. I am directed to say that the Council approve all the recommendations made, with the exception of Sir A. Stanley Woodwark as a possible speaker on that occasion. The Council were of the opinion that this name was not quite up to the level of the other names proposed, and recommended that it should be deleted from the list.

The recommendations, therefore, of the Organisation Committee as approved by the Council of Bedford College are as follows:-

Arrangements for the Presentation of Certificates 1936.

1. That H.R.H. The Duchess of Kent be asked to present the Certificates to the International Students.

2. That Dame Alicia Lloyd-Still be asked to propose the name of some Sister of high standing in the Hospital world, who would speak to the students from the professional point of view.
3. That one of the following in the order stated be invited to make the principal speech:

Senor Salvador de Madariaga;
The New Secretary-General of the
League of Red Cross Societies, (to be
elected).
4. That in the event of it being impossible to secure speakers from the above list the matter be left in the hands of Dame Alicia Lloyd-Still, Chairman of the F.N.I.F., and the Principal of Bedford College.
5. That the Ceremony of the Presentation of Certificates be fixed for Thursday, 2nd July 1936, at 3.30 p.m.
