Report of Tutor for Public Health Students.

January 18th 1937

There is very little to report to this Committee. Since my last report the Public Health Group have done little or no practical work.

With the exception of Miss de Klerk, the students had a full theoretical course last term, and no time for practical work. They had a vacation at Christmas.

Miss de Klerk's theory has been purposely curtailed to enable her to do more practical work, and she has been seeing school nursery work and nursery schools. She has been to the North London L.C.C. District and to Surrey, and has had a careful programme planned for her.

This term, more time is being given to practical observation, and I am arranging with each student individually. They have now all seen the chief types of public health services in London and are spending time in studying the phases they are most interested in.
