## REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL NURSE ADMINISTRATOR STUDENTS

MICHAELMAS TERM 1931.

Out of a group of ~~fifteen~~ students, eight are taking the course for Nurse Administrators and Teachers in Schools of Nursing this year. These represent the countries of :-

Finland,	Greece,
Hungary,	Bulgaria,
Italy,	Poland,
Great Britain,	New Zealand.

These students, since arrival in England, have been gaining experience in Training School Administration in certain hospitals in London for two sessions of three weeks and four weeks respectively.

Miss Bourni (Greece)	have been to St. Thomas's Hospital
Miss Senni (Italy)	for the first three weeks, and to King's College Hospital for another four weeks.
Miss Menich (Hungary)	have been to St. Mary's Hospital for three weeks and then to University College Hospital for four weeks, residing during this latter session at Manchester Square, and going each day to hospital.

Miss Barnett )	first session and to St. Thomas's Hospital for the second session.
Miss Nikodimova )	have been at King's College Hospital
Miss Wilkomirska )	for the first session and at St. Mary's Hospital, Paddington, for the second session.

Very satisfactory reports have been received from <sup>nearly all</sup> the Matrons of these hospitals on the work and observations of the students, and the students themselves are writing reports of their experiences.

The students are now attending lectures on "Hospital and Training School Administration" at the College of Nursing, and a series of coaching classes have been arranged in connection with these on Tuesday and Friday afternoons.
