

Report from Bedford College for Women (University of London)  
on the work of the Committee for the Organisation  
of Courses for International Students for  
the year 1934-35.

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The work of the Organisation Committee for 1934-35 has been carried out on the invitation of the Committee of Management of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation. The procedure has been identical with that followed in previous years, in accordance with which arrangements have been made in conjunction with the College of Nursing, acting through their representatives on the Organisation Committee.

A. Constitution of the Committee

The Council of Bedford College, at the request of the Committee of Management of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation reconstituted the Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students as follows:-

The Principal of Bedford College in the Chair.  
Two representatives of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation.  
Three representatives of the College of Nursing.  
All full time teachers concerned in the Courses.  
The Tutors on the practical side for the students training as Public Health Visitors or Nurse Administrators.  
The Secretary of Bedford College.

The Director of Social Studies at Bedford College is responsible to the Committee for the organisation of the students' work.

The final decision on the questions of curriculum and courses of studies is with the Council of Bedford College as advised by the Committee.

Function of the Committee

As before.

B. Summary of work done by the Committee during the session 1934-35.

Number of Meetings.

The Committee have held three meetings, one in October, January and May respectively, and will hold their final one for the session on June 27th 1935.

Student Business.

The Committee had received applications to the courses from a number of students, and the following attended the different courses during the session 1934-35:-

- a. Course for Nurse Administrators and Teachers in Schools of Nursing.  
10 students. (*analysis in countries*)
- b. Course in Public Health.  
10 students. (*analysis in countries*)
- c. Course in Social Work. (*opened for the 1st time 1934-35*)  
1 student.

The Committee have received reports on the general conduct of the course from Mrs. Reid, Director of the Department of Social Studies, and also reports from the Tutors on the practical work.

The work has continued smoothly throughout the session. There has been less language difficulty than usual, as only 5 of the 21 students started the session unable to follow readily. Discussion classes have been held since Easter.

Curriculum.

The Committee made several alterations in the curriculum for 1935-36, which, however, involved no changes in lecturers except in Hygiene.

Appointment of Teachers.

The Committee have arranged for the appointment and re-appointment of Lecturers and other teachers necessary for the courses.

Certificate of Award at the end of the courses.

The Committee have made arrangements for the ceremony of the presentation of Certificates on July 4th 1935.

The Committee will make recommendations for the award of certificates on the recommendations of the teachers concerned, at their next meeting on June 27th 1935.
