Dear Miss Roxburgh,

Thank you for your letter of 22nd October. I am asked to enquire from you what exactly your Council intend by the phrase "full training for Social Work". Should we be right to interpret it to mean a course including both theoretical and practical work?

I am asked to make this enquiry because it is understood that there are some countries in which the University prepares Students for a Diploma in Sociology which does not include practical experience. Mrs. Reid has been told that in Poland, for example, the Diploma granted by the Warsaw University is not recognised by Public Bodies as preparing for posts in Social Work, for which Public Health workers are being utilised.
