Dear Miss Rundle,

At the last meeting of the Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students the question of continuing the present arrangements for the International Course after the close of the current session was discussed. The Committee was reminded that the College of Nursing had in the first place only agreed to the scheme for a period of two years, which period terminates August 31st 1929. The Committee was unanimous in desiring that the course should be continued on the present lines at least for the session 1929-30 and the following resolutions were passed:-

"That a recommendation be sent forward to the College of Nursing and to the Council of Bedford College that the present scheme for the organisation of courses for International Students be continued for the session 1929-30, provided that the League of Red Cross Societies are prepared to continue their grant towards the expenses of the course on the same lines as at present."

"That the whole question of the continuance of the organisation of courses for International Students after the close of the session 1929-30 be reconsidered at an early date."

I am directed to ask you to bring the matter before your Governing Body and to express the hope that the College of Nursing will be able to agree to the proposals made.
