Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Thank you for the copy of the observations concerning the Report of the Study Committee. I have nothing to add to these which I think embody admirably all the decisions come to by the Organisation Committee.

The section on page 2 concerning recommendations 11 to 14, about which we spoke on the telephone, gives me considerable difficulty. I wondered whether a phrase such as the following could be inserted after recommendation 10 in the place of the sentence beginning "no move.."

"This excludes the possibility of the establishment of an Academic Diploma of Nursing in any existing school of the University, and postpones any such move until the College of Nursing has established a connection with the University of London"

This, or something similar would, I feel, be possibly less negative than the present statement. I suggest "any existing school" but I myself would be quite happy to see "Bedford College for Women" substituted for those words.
