Dear Miss Monkhouse,

I am forwarding under separate cover fifteen copies of the complete list of International Students taking the Courses this year. The only one who has not yet been formally admitted by your committee is Miss Petschnigg (Austria). I am also sending you the formal recommendation for her admission; copies of her applications forms have already been sent you.

Our total this year is fourteen which is rather less than in previous years, with the exception of 1921-22. It is difficult to attribute the decrease in numbers to any one single factor, but it may be due to some extent to the general economic depression everywhere, which has had its effect upon National Red Cross Societies. The League has also limited its scholarships this year to those nurses going back to work with their Red Cross Societies and has awarded two less than in previous years. The number of students for the Public Health Course is five and for the Course for Nurse Administrators and Teachers in Schools of Nursing is nine. This is the first year that the Hospital Group has condiferably outnumbered the Public Health Group; it just happens that the demand for scholarships is greater for nurses going back to institutional posts.

I am forwarding you a copy of the curriculum; the re-print will contain certain minor corrections, which you will see have been made in ink in this copy. The special points I should like to draw your attention to are:

(1) Page 7 - lines 1, 2 and 3.



Who is to replace Professor Edkins?
Is Miss Hallowes' title to remain the same?

- (2) Page 19. Maternity and Child Welfare.
 The new text is required.
- Name of Lecturer to replace Professor Edkins?
- (4) Page 24. Principles of Hospital and Training School Administration.

It was decided at the last meeting to return to the former arrangement and present this as two subjects and this will be done in the re-print the outlines have already been received from the respective lecturers.

I think these cover all the points of any importance.

I am leaving for Brussels on October 5th. to attend the International Red Cross Conference and will be staying at the Hotel Gallia et Britannique, Bd. du Régent, Brussels if you should wish to get in touch with me that week. I am not quite sure if I will be able to go to London on October 13th. in order to be present at your meeting; it will depend very much on what happens at the Conference in Brussels.
