Dear Madam

I am instructed to inform you that at a meeting of the Board of Education of this College the desirability of maintaining a course in Hospital Economics is to be considered.

I am directed to ask you, as a member of the Matrons' Council, if you will be willing to attend the meeting to confer with the Board on this subject. I have also been directed to invite Miss Isla Stewart. The meeting is to be held on Monday, March 9th, at 5.30 p.m.

At the proposed conference it would be desirable to consider (1) the nature of the course required; (2) the extent to which teaching given in the College would already provide for part of the course; (3) the length of the course required; (4) what likelihood there is of such a course being made use of by nurses; (5) what steps could be taken to secure the co-operation of other persons and institutions interested in the training of nurses for the purpose of framing and advertising the course; (6) what provision is at present made in London by hospitals for post-graduate courses in Hospital Economics.
