Dear Miss Jebb,

At the first meeting of the Committee of Management held on July 6th the preliminary arrangements made with Bedford College by the Provisional Committee for the International Courses for the session 1934/1935 were approved.

Miss Olive Baggallay was appointed Secretary of the Foundation and was, at the same time, permitted to continue to hold the post of Tutor to the International Students, on the staff of Bedford College.

Provision has been made in the budget for £400 (£200 each) for the salary of two Tutors appointed by Bedford College. In addition provision has been made for the College fees at the rate of £50 per head per student to include all lecture fees, and fees for practical work.

The Committee of Management expressed the wish that the Council of Bedford College be asked to reconstitute the special committee appointed by your Council to include representatives of the Foundation.
