Dear Miss Jebb,

You will have received by now the Minutes of the Grand Council meeting held in Stockholm, in June 1949, containing in detail the changes which will be taking place in the Foundation as from November 1949.

For your information I am attaching herewith copy of a statement recently issued by the International Council of Nurses to its member associations. I trust that you will feel that this statement is a helpful summary of the position and status of the F.N.I.F. following the decisions made at Stockholm last June.

I know you realise that basically the objectives of the Foundation have not changed. They remain directed towards facilitating higher nursing education among nurses the world over. The combined efforts of all those concerned will be needed now,

as they were in the past, in order to achieve these objectives, to work out ways and means of supporting the activities of the Foundation as well as to assist in its development.

The loyalty and interest and very generous support which you have shown to the Foundation to this date was recognised by the Grand Council at their last meeting when the following resolution was passed:

"The Grand Council would like to thank also the twelve Vice-Presidents, four of whom we are so happy to have with us to-day, Miss Messolora, Dame Ellen Musson, Mademoiselle Lucie Odier, Miss Mary Roberts. We remember with gratefulness all their activities and the devotion they have given for the welfare and development of the Foundation, and we trust they will be able to continue this great contribution in the newly constituted body."

Before giving up my duties as Chairman of the Committee of Management, on November 12th, I should like to express also my personal appreciation to you for your assistance, and the wish that you will see fit to continue to give your support to the programme of the Foundation in the future as generously as you have done in the past.
