Dear Miss Goodall,

I have had information, though not from Miss Bridges herself, that she has undertaken some National Service at Addenbroke's Hospital, Cambridge. If this is the case her appointment as full-time Tutor to the International Students held jointly from Bedford College and the Royal College of Nursing is automatically dissolved for the time being. There are three points with which my Council will be glad to know that your Council concurs:

1. That in the event of the above information being correct, Miss Bridges be written to confirming that her appointment as Tutor to the International Students is automatically dissolved for the time being.
2. That in the event of the above information not being correct, Miss Bridges be informed that the Courses for the International Group will be discontinued indefinitely and that her appointment will therefore be terminated by three months' notice as from 1st October 1939 in accordance with her conditions of appointment.
3. That Miss Bridges be informed that it is hoped that as soon as the trouble is at an end and the International Courses restarted she will be able to resume her duties as Tutor in Practical Work.

I write this letter in some haste as I understood from you over the telephone that you are having a meeting of your Council this evening.
