

BRITISH RED CROSS SOCIETY'S BAZAAR.

Generous International Support.

An interesting collection of varied goods, gifts from 36 countries, is now passing through the British Customs in preparation for the British Red Cross Society's International Bazaar, which is to be held at the Central Hall, Westminster, S.W.1, on July 7th and 8th next.

The bazaar is a gesture on the part of the British Red Cross Society in aid of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation, which has its headquarters in London, and which constitutes a permanent memorial to Florence Nightingale in the form of an endowed trust for post-graduate scholarships providing advanced courses of nursing at Bedford College.

The special training given by the Foundation includes courses dealing with Public Health, Administration and Teaching in Schools of Nursing, and social work, for women who have had the best nursing training available in their own countries.

"Learning and Leadership" is the watchword of the Foundation's effort to achieve an international service of lasting value to nursing and to humanity.

The bazaar will be opened by the Lady Mayoress of London (Lady Broadbridge), who will be received by the Countess Granville, chairman of the Bazaar Committee, and the Mayor and Mayoress of Westminster (the Hon. Arthur Howard and Lady Lorna Howard), supported by Sir Arthur Stanley, Sir Edward Stewart, Sir Harold Fawcus, and Dame Beryl Oliver, representing the British Red Cross Society.

H.R.H. the Duchess of Kent has consented to visit the bazaar in the afternoon of the opening day (July 7th), and guards of honour for the Lady Mayoress and the Duchess of Kent will be provided by members of the Voluntary Aid Detachment.
