Dear Miss Rundle,

I am enclosing a copy of a memorandum containing proposals for the foundation of an International Memorial to Florence Nightingale, together with a copy of the resolutions passed by the Executive Committee of the League of Red Cross Societies at its meeting held on April 25th 1932. The Secretary General of the League of Red Cross Societies asks to be informed whether the Council of Bedford College and the College of Nursing are in agreement with these proposals.

The matter has been before the Committee for the Organisation of Courses for International Students and before the Council of Bedford College who passed the following resolution:-

"That the Council of Bedford College are in agreement with the proposals for the foundation of an International Memorial to Florence Nightingale and with the resolutions passed by the Executive Committee of the League of Red Cross Societies at its meeting held on April 25th 1932 provided that, should the plans for the International Florence Nightingale Memorial Foundation in London mature and it be desired that Bedford College take any part in the educational work, responsibility for the conduct of the courses be under the control of the Council of Bedford College in the same way as they at present control the courses for International Students under the League of Red Cross Societies."

Will you be good enough to let me know whether the College of Nursing are also willing to agree to the proposals set forth in the memorandum enclosed and would be prepared to co-operate with the Council of Bedford College in the organisation of the courses in the same way as hitherto?
