Report on Candidates.

Three candidates presented themselves for examination, viz., Miss Jenkins, Miss Marx, and Miss Lamm, the two first taking the whole examination, the last certain subjects only.

I find that Miss Jenkins and Miss Marx have a very fair knowledge of their subjects, the former being better in the practical work, the latter in the theoretical. The differences in the two sets of papers of the two candidates practically balance themselves, so that by total marks, the two candidates were almost equal. Miss Jenkins, however, has a more methodical and intelligent manner of setting out her knowledge than Miss Marx. Both candidates should make good sanitary inspectors, if they take up that avocation.

Miss Lamm appears to have a very poor knowledge of hygiene and physiology. She did fairly well in bacteriology, the third subject for which she presented herself. Even after making allowance for a possible difficulty in expressing herself in English, her answers, except those in bacteriology, were very unsatisfactory.
