Dear Miss Tuke,

Thank you for your letter. We are very glad to think that it may be possible for Mrs Ekins to lecture to our students. 5.30p.m. would be quite a possible hour for them.

When Mrs Ekins gave a course some years ago she gave, I think, 20 lectures on applied Physiology and hygiene covering the autumn and lent terms.
