Dear Mrs Thomas,

When you wrote to me in January about the possibility of arranging a course of lectures in Applied Physiology for the session 1922-23 I said that the question would have to be considered later. I now write to say that I believe it would be possible for Mrs Edkins to give a course of lectures such as you desire, provided they were held not earlier than 5.30 p.m. I realise that this may make the course out of the question for you. The alternative would be for your students to take advantage of the course arranged for our Social Studies students. I understand that this would not be quite so satisfactory from your point of view and it would mean longer hours. The lectures are held on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 2-3 and students are sometimes required to remain from 3-4, when the lecture is followed by a demonstration.

I shall be glad to hear from you as soon as possible whether either of these proposals will meet your need. I am sorry that we cannot offer a special course in the ordinary college hours.
