Miss Baggallay spoke to me about an International student who wanted to attend lectures at the Institute of Medical Psychology, courses A and C on the paper attached. The fee for this will be 9 guineas. The question arises as to whether the Finance Committee will allow this to be paid on the basis of an intercollegiate fee out of the fees paid to the College. This raises a question of precedent, since under our new arrangements divergencies from the normal course for Internationals are likely to be much in demand. The matter had to be settled at once and I authorised Miss Baggallay, subject to Mr. Mace's approval, to make the arrangements with the student on the understanding that intercollegiate fees would be paid for her, it being understood that this arrangement should not be regarded as a precedent until the general question had been settled. Miss Baggallay had consulted Dr. Mess who had approved, subject to the financial side being satisfactorily arranged.
