Dear Miss Tuke,

Our General Council Meeting has just terminated and the delegates from every country spoke with great appreciation of the International course being conducted at Bedford College. We are most anxious to repeat the course and several countries have intimated a desire to send one or more students. The only difficulty is the expense and owing to the exchange some of the Red Cross Societies find £250 plus travelling expenses to and from London a severe tax upon their budget. We are therefore endeavouring to cut down this total and wonder if it would be possible for you to reduce the tuition fees for the coming year. I quite realise that our students require more individual attention and instruction than the other students of the college and that therefore their tuition fees should be higher than those charged for the Health Visitors course, but if it would be possible for you to help us in this direction, we should be most grateful and we should be enabled to hold the course again at Bedford College, which we are most anxious to do.
