General Guidance Note

To give the Commission as useful a perspective as possible, it is requested that responses be made in two ways:

- (a) by indicating the degree of agreement or disagreement to the statement on the scale immediately beneath the statement; and
- (b) by using the blank space beneath the scale to write narrative comments, to be continued on a separate sheet if necessary, in which the basic response can be elaborated.

It would be very helpful to the analysis of this information if the identity of the organisation, department, etc. completing the document could be indicated at the foot of the final page.

Student rather than employee status has two objectives in mind:

- 1) a a more comprehensive development of a student is likely if complex conflict situations which arise as a result of a labour contract with the employing agency is non-existent
 - b that the student can be directed to obtain valed learning experiences which are not necessarily available within the boundary of anyone employing authority.
 - c) that teaching and learning can take an undisputed priority over the need to provide labour for the employment agency
- 2) a that the employing agency is prevented from using the student as a source of manpower .
 - b that an employment agency be prevented from confusing students' interests with its own
 - c that an employment agency be prevented from employing disciplinary measures, those resulting from employment-contract conflicts.

We need to find out what is meant by too many, whether indeed the service would result in a better delivery of care if all the personnel were highly trained and where partially or non-trained personnel have a role to play.
