REPORT OF PRACTICAL WORK OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

PUBLIC HEALTH COURSE.

August 20th - September 28th, 1928 (6 weeks)

Practical work was arranged for fifteen (15) students. They were divided into two groups of which Group A were the more advanced; being better linguists or more experienced Public Health workers. Group B contained the Orientals - five in all, and three of the Europeans whose English was poor.

Four weeks work was arranged for Group A, outside London, mainly in Croydon, Surrey and Bristol. One of the students by her own request worked with the North London District Nursing Association.

Group B worked for four weeks in Lambeth, where the work was carefully planned for them in order that they might see the various types of work and also have time to be coached in what they had seen.

Owing to the kind co-operation of St. Thomas's Hospital, the Lambeth Public Health Department and the various Infant Welfare Associations in the district - each student in Group B was able to have individual attention and a good period of observation. The Mothercraft Department - the V.D.Department and the Tuberculosis Department at the Hospital all had more than one student and gave us every help. The St. Thomas's Babies Hostel had two students during the month who received special tuition in dietetics as well as seeing the routine work of the Hostel.

During the last two weeks of the time, a special programme was planned for both groups in Lambeth. Dr. Thompson - M.O.H. had each group separately and arranged for them to be shown the work being done in Lambeth directly under his Department. His Health Visitors, Sanitary Inspectors and Clerks all took part in showing and explaining their work, and the students had a very instructive time.

I should like to propose that a special letter of thanks be sent to him from this Committee for his kind co-operation - also that a similar one be sent to Dr. Holden - M.O.H. for Croydon who took considerable trouble in planning four weeks observation for Miss Holzer and Miss Lippert in Croydon.

I attach to this report a copy of Dr. Holden's letter to me stating what had been arranged for these students during their four weeks. The letter needs no elaboration.

I should like also to propose that the St. Thomas's Babies Hostel be paid a tuition fee for each student sent from this Course. The student has special and careful tuition here in infant dietetics and finds it of great value. The Hostel is self-supporting and not wealthy, and a small fee would probably be acceptable.

I have attached to this report the details of the work done by each student, and the work arranged for them throughout the coming term. We have, also, reports on the individual students written in collaboration with those with whom they have been working.

In conclusion I should like to say how much we are indebted to Miss Cummins and Miss Lloyd Still at St. Thomas's Hospital - to Miss James at the St. Thomas's Babies Hostel:

Dear Miss Baggallay,

I herewith have pleasure in enclosing programme of the work done by the two Austrian ladies who were here to study public health administration etc.

1. MATERNITY AND CHILD WELFARE.

They visited and saw the work of Infant Welfare Centres, Ante-Natal Clinics, the Municipal Sick Nursery for Ailing Babies, a voluntary creche and St. Mary's Hostel, a voluntary maternity home. In addition they paid district visits with the health visitors and also on one afternoon paid visits by themselves and reported to me.

2. SCHOOL MEDICAL SERVICE.

They accompanied the school nurses at routine medical inspection of school children by medical inspectors; they also visited the ultraviolet light clinic; throat clinic, eye clinic, dental clinic, orthopaedic clinic, ionisation clinic for chronic ear disease, the remedial exercises clinic, breathing exercises clinic, flat foot class, and they watched the work of the masseuse.

3. TUBERCULOSIS.

They attended one half day at the Tuberculosis Dispensary.

4. MENTAL DEFICIENCY.

They spent two days with the special visitor under the Mental Deficiency Act who took them with her on her visiting, and explained to them the working of the Act, and shewed them the Mental Deficiency School and the Occupation Centre for Ineducable Children.

5. VENEREAL DISEASES.

They visited the Coldharbour Home for Children suffering from venereal disease on one half day.

6. INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

They visited the Fever Hospital and were shown round by one of the Medical Officers on one half day. They also visited the Croydon

General Hospital on another half day.

7. GENERAL SANITARY WORK.

They accompanied two of the Sanitary Inspectors on their districts and were shewn Common Lodging Houses, Factories, Workshops, Food Shops, the Municipal Slaughterhouse, the Municipal Lodging House, Cleansing and Disinfecting Station. They also inspected old and new housing property accompanied by an Inspector. This took three days.

In addition they accompanied the Inspector of Foster mothers who explained to them the working of the Children's Act and took them with her on her visits of inspection to fostermothers. They also visited the Work-house, the Cottage Home, and the Poor Law Infirmary. This took two days.

They also accompanied the Lady Probation Officer who explained to them her work, and they sat with her during an affiliation Order trial in Court. This took one day.

In addition they were shewn a new school erected in Croydon.

I think the above is a brief summary. From an account of their experience which both of them made to me in writing I think that they have grasped fairly clearly the essence and this should form a good basis for further enquiries into English social work.
