Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Thank you very much for your letter of March 8th with reference to inviting Miss Reimann, the Secretary of the International Council of Nursing, to attend the Summer School. We had already written to her asking her if she would be so kind as to speak on the subject of Nursing Legislature, and Nursing Organisations. In our letter, we suggested that she be prepared to give at least two or three discussions of two hours each. These are both very big subjects, and I am doubtful if Miss Reimann can possibly cover the ground in a morning lecture. She has kindly consented to come for the last week of the Summer School. Her presence will be a very great help to us, as she is extremely well informed on the conditions prevailing in European countries.

I shall be very glad to hear from you if Lord Cecil has consented to open the Summer School, in order that we can get our programme prepared.

I am delighted to learn that St. Thomas' Hospital are willing to co-operate with Bedford College for the practical work of the International Students. I feel sure that this will be a more satisfactory arrangement than the recent one with Battersea. The Secretary General will be very interested to know in a little more detail how it is proposed to work out this scheme.
