Further to my letter of the 21st August, 1985, copy of which is enclosed, I hope that Nursing Student is settling down well on your ward. Mr. Nazeer in his capacity as a part-time nurse tutor will oversee the nursing student's clinical supervision and I will also come along and make contact with you to ensure the contribution of a good communication system between staff and students. As you know this will be the student's last year of study and the period on your ward will be concluded with the taking of assessment IV showing a competence in ward management which is underpinned by a course in nursing management details of which are enclosed for your information. We would very much appreciate if at the end of the period you would hand directly to the student both her ward report as well as her completed assessment form so that the student can take the responsibility for the completion of her own documentation.

As to the decision when to enter the student to take the assessment I feel this should be left to a consideration between you, the student and Mr. Nazeer but perhaps the student might be given a month to settle in before being asked to perform. Ideally this should take place sometime midway between October and December so that, should the student fail, a repeat can be organised on your ward before the student moves on to do her geriatric module during the Spring Term.

Please feel free to contact our office at the above number where someone will be every morning from 9.00 to 12.30 p.m. from Monday to and including Thursday. I am still in the process of working out how Mr. Nazeer can be contacted and will let you know as soon as arrangements have been finalised.

You will be pleased to hear that last year's nursing students have all been successful in obtaining their degree in Nursing Studies and their RGN registration and all have settled well into their first posts. This would not have been possible without the Sisters' and Middlesex Hospital's support which both initiated the course and was involved in its clinical educational dimensions.
